"Supporting people with Learning Disabilities"





People with learning disabilities would come into contact with Criminal Justice Social Work Services if they have been found guilty by a court.

Sometimes witnesses and victims who have a learning disability come into contact with Criminal Justice Social Work Services.



There are laws to protect the rights of people with learning disabilities in the criminal justice system.



The Procurator Fiscal may refer the person to Criminal Justice Social Work Services *instead* of making them go to court.



Some people with learning disabilities may re-offend when they leave prison.

Throughcare Services can help people with learning disabilities by:



Being involved in planning for discharge from Prison

Supervising some people discharged from Prison



Working with some people discharged from Prison for up to a year after discharge

Some people have to accept support as part of their discharge from Prison
